A RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING THE VILLAGE OF LAKEMORE WILL OBSERVE APRIL 2022 AS

WHEREAS, more than 700 injury crashes involve distracted driving on an average day and the economic toll of all motor vehicle crashes in the U.S. annually exceeds \$400 billion;

WHEREAS, talking on a mobile phone even in hands-free mode, texting, programming your dashboard infotainment system or GPS device can divert your attention away from driving and result in physical or cognitive distraction;

WHEREAS, The Village of Lakemore residents and all Americans deserve to live in communities that promote safe driving behaviors and healthy lifestyles;

WHEREAS, preventing distracted driving injuries and deaths requires the cooperation of all levels of government, employers and the general public;

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AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 1743-2021 “MAKE APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE VILLAGE OF LAKEMORE, STATE OF OHIO. DURING THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2022”

Now, Therefore, Be it Ordained by the Council of the Village of Lakemore, County of Summit, State of Ohio:

Section 1: Council approves to increase appropriations in:  
American Rescue Act Fund 2053 \$642.34 for Police Salaries  
Street Construction, Maintenance and Repair Fund 2011 \$7,500 for Mowing Services  
General Fund Parks \$45,000 for Concession Stand Project

Section 2: Council approves to increase revenues in:  
American Rescue Act Fund 2053 \$642.34 for Police Salaries

Section 3: Treasury for payments from any of the forgoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefore, approved by the board or officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of Council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. It shall be provided further that the appropriations for contingencies can only be expended upon appeal of two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the village for purposes other than those covered by other specific appropriations herein made.

Section 4: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Village of Lakemore, Ohio. Therefore, this Ordinance shall go into effect immediately.
