A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF LAKEMORE TO ENTER INTO AN
AGREEMENT WITH SOUTH SUMMIT COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS

WHEREAS, the South Summit Council of Governments (SSCOG) shall provide emergency fire and medical dispatching services to Lakemore for calls which are received by SSCOg which originate in Lakemore on a twenty-four (24) hour per day, seven (7) day per week basis.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved by the Council of the Village of Lakemore, Ohio:

- Section 1: That the Village of Lakemore to enter into an agreement with South Summit Council of Governments for dispatching services.
- Section 2: The term of this agreement shall commence July 1st, 2021 and end on December 31st, 2024.
- Section 3: The cost of the services for the three and half years will be \$102,070.00.
- Section 4: A copy of the Agreement is attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully rewritten.
- Section 5: That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council or any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- Section 6: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Village of Lakemore, Ohio, for the continued operation of the Village of Lakemore. Therefore, this Resolution shall go into effect immediately.

RESOLUTION NO. 7100-2021

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF LAKEMORE TO INFORM THE CITIZENS REGARDING SEPTEMBER BEING PROSTATE CANCER AWARENESS AND EDUCATION MONTH

WHEREAS, this year approximately 248,530 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in the United States alone every year and roughly 34,130 will die this year from the disease; and

WHEREAS, Every 15 minutes another American man dies from prostate cancer. That's a little more than 93 deaths per day and 34,130 this year; and

WHEREAS, in Ohio an estimated 9,010 new cases of prostate cancer will be diagnosed and an estimated 2,000 deaths will occur in 2021; and

WHEREAS, 1 in 8 men are diagnosed with prostate cancer in his lifetime. African American men are at the highest risk for the disease with the rate of 1 in 6 and 2.2 times more likely to die for the disease; and

WHEREAS, Men with relatives – father, brother, son – with a history of prostate cancer are twice as likely to develop the disease; and

WHEREAS, Men who served in the military who have been exposed to chemicals and herbicides are at a higher risk for developing prostate cancer; and

WHEREAS, Education regarding prostate cancer and early detection strategies is critical to saving lives, preserving, and protecting our families. The economic and social hardship it has on the families is huge; Prostate cancer is estimated to cost over \$8 billion in direct medical expenditures; and

WHEREAS, Nearly 3.1 million men in the U.S. are living with prostate cancer diagnosis; that number is estimated to climb 4 million by 2024 as men in the baby boomer generation age; and

WHEREAS, all men are at risk of prostate cancer and we encourage the citizens of Lakemore to increase the importance of prostate screening

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved by the Council of the Village of Lakemore, Ohio:

Section 1: That the Village of Lakemore to inform the citizens regarding September being Prostate Cancer Awareness and Education month.

Section 2: That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council or any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Village of Lakemore, Ohio, for the continued operation of the Village of Lakemore. Therefore, this Resolution shall go into effect immediately.

ORDINANCE NO 1731-2021

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 1696-2020 “MAKE APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE VILLAGE OF LAKEMORE, STATE OF OHIO. DURING THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2021”

Now, Therefore, Be it Ordained by the Council of the Village of Lakemore, County of Summit, State of Ohio:

Section 1: Council approves to increase appropriations in:
Fire/EMS Operating Levy Professional and Technical Services \$2,200 for Property Tax Deductions
General Fund Professional and Technical Services \$11,500 for Property Tax Deductions
Emergency Medical Services \$5,000 for fire fuel
General Fund Professional and Technical Services \$1,000 for Police Training
General Fund Uniforms and Clothing \$1,000 for Police Uniforms
General Fund Motor Vehicles \$5,000 for Police Vehicle Maintenance
Water Fund Supplies and Materials \$30,000 for Water Meters
General Fund Tax Collection Fees \$15,000 for RITA Fees

Section 2: Council approves appropriations in:
Police Supplies and Materials \$20,000 from the American Rescue Act Fund
Emergency Medical Services Supplies and Materials \$20,000 from the American Rescue Act Fund

Section 3: Treasury for payments from any of the forgoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefore, approved by the board or officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of Council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. It shall be provided further that the appropriations for contingencies can only be expended upon appeal of two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the village for purposes other than those covered by other specific appropriations herein made.

Section 4: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Village of Lakemore, Ohio. Therefore, this Ordinance shall go into effect immediately.

Section 4: This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure in the interest of the health, peace, and safety of the citizens of the Village of Lakemore; therefore this Ordinance shall take effect immediately.
