Mayor’s Report

Mayor Justice explained the reductions and sacrifices made since 2009 to come out of fiscal emergency. The income tax credit was reduced. The police department services were contracted out to Springfield Township. Now that the village is out of fiscal emergency, the income tax credit has been restored. The staff sizes are increasing. The police department has been returned. Mayor Justice expressed thanks to Springfield Township, those who worked to create the police department, and Council. He also thanked those newly hired police employees and the Lions Club for finishing the police building. He also thanked BC Nwade and Pastor Jeff Gindlesburger for blessing the new police station and officers.

Mayor Justice expressed his appreciation for the strong built with Springfield Township and looks forward to working with them on various projects.

Department Head Reports

Gene Taylor announced the storm sewer and paving work began on Mohican Boulevard.

Council Reports

Ms. Snyder announced the library has approved everything to locate in Tri-County Plaza. The plaza owners have 90 days to prepare the location.

Mrs. Cochran thanked everyone who helped get the department and building ready. She mentioned the Lakemore Lions volunteered and have donated over 100 hours so far to the community.

Mrs. Cochran thanked everyone for making the Memorial Day Parade a success. The service at the Memorial Triangle was nice. She thanked Jill Cramer for assisting with reading the names of those who died while serving in the military. She thanked the auxiliary police for lining up the parade and working to keep the roads blocked.

Mr. Cole announced a fundraiser spaghetti dinner for Mike McQuellin will be June 10th at Springfield High School.

Mr. Cole thanked all who attended the “painting with a twist” Lions Club event. The group raised enough money to purchase two safety vests for the fire department.

Mr. Cole thanked Summit DD for volunteering in our community. A group of over 30 people planted flowers, finished the tabletop games, and painted the fence at the soccer field.

Mr. Cole thanked Mick and Connie Krunich for donating towards the Lion’s Club event to afford safety vests for the fire department.

Mr. Timko thanked everyone who attended the Memorial Day fire department breakfast.

Mr. Timko expressed his appreciation for the 24-hour coverage the fire department now provides; the roads that have been improved; the water tower improvement; the library moving into our community; and the police department returning to the community.

Mr. Ty Clapp asked if the Department of Public Services could pick up the piles of brush and debris he left after he trimmed and weeded at Dodds Park.

Mrs. Berdie Zabalaha reported there are four kids in her neighborhood who have shot out windows with guns.

Mr. Chris Mogilnicki asked if the village could alter the dead end of Lakeview Street so residents from Forest Drive could no longer cut through the property.

Mr. Mogilnicki asked if the village could fill the pot holes on his street.

Mr. Mogilnicki asked if the village could enforce the zoning for the vacant property next to him as people are parking their boat trailers there.

BC Nwade introduced himself and welcomed everyone to his church. He expressed his appreciation for the community and wanted to let the village know his church wants to be involved.

New Business:

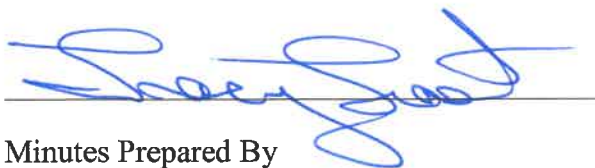
