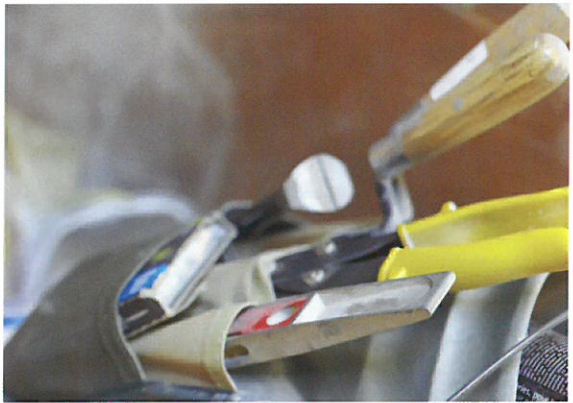

Lead paint was used in homes until 1978. More than 38 million homes may still contain lead paint. Worn down lead paint puts lead paint chips and lead dust where children may come in contact and become lead-poisoned. DIY home projects with tear-down, sanding, or power-washing can cause lead exposure.

HUD Lead-Based Paint Hazard Control Grant Program

This program enables Summit County homeowners and landlords to apply for grant money to address lead-based paint hazards in residential properties built before 1978.

The grant money can be used to replace parts of the house covered with lead paint, such as windows, doors, porches, wood siding, and other structures of the house.

To be eligible, the home must:

- Have been built before 1978
- Have a pregnant woman or child under age 6 in residence, or serve as a childcare location for a child under age 6
- Be located in Summit County

In addition, homeowners or tenants must meet the 2014 income guidelines listed on the back of this brochure.
